HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

Emily's Story



Before I found help from Florence Crittenton I was living in a small apartment, working full time with 2 small children with little help or support from a partner with mental health issues. I felt overwhelmed. I wanted to be the best mom I could to my two beautiful blessings and to encourage their development. I felt that I was struggling to meet all their needs and that I was fighting to give them a happy, healthy, enriching life as well getting to a doctor to listen to my concerns.

Florence Crittenton's Home Visitor provided a much-needed resource of support to help ensure my children were meeting milestones and gave us extra resources to further their

development mentally and physically. The Home Visitor also gave us resources for getting my

eldest child treated for Asthma by bringing in an asthma nurse who also educated us about asthma and helped us to make life better. Our home visitor also provided emotional support which I really appreciated.

I learned so many new ways to encourage my children to grow in all aspects. I now feel like I am succeeding as a mom. I feel that my parenting skills are improving to meet the needs of my kids as they grow, and new aspects arrive.

Without our home visitor's help, I would probably still be feeling overwhelmed. I am sure I would be fighting with doctors to get my daughter help with asthma because her symptoms are mild, and she would still be having trouble getting good rest. I would be questioning myself about parenting, wondering what kinds of things I should be doing with them to encourage their growth. My son just graduated from speech therapy in Head Start, thanks to encouragement and activities from our home visitor and speech therapist.

Having a home visitor has made a big difference to our family. Today we are doing great, we still have challenges, but we are working through them with support. My children are excelling and exceeding milestones. They communicate well for their ages and I feel confident and supported as a parent.

These programs are so important. Successful families make successful future families and this program creates a village that all families need. I have really loved having our home visitor. My home was in need of support and was struggling. We have come so far to having a happy, healthy, growing home. Our home visitor has been a huge part of our success by providing support and resources that have changed our lives for the better.

HOME VISITING PROGRAMS

SAFE CARE:

SafeCare home visiting serves families with children ages 0-5 by providing prevention-based services across 3 domains: parent/child or infant interaction, safety, and health. SafeCare is typically conducted in weekly home visits lasting from 60-90 minutes each. The program typically lasts 18-20 weeks for each family.

PARENTS AS TEACHERS

Parents As Teachers © (PAT) serves families prenatally through 5 years of age. PAT home visitors work with parents/ caregivers in their home setting to increase parent knowledge of early childhood development and improve parenting practices, provide early detection of developmental delays and health issues, prevent child abuse and neglect, and increase children's school readiness and school success. PAT visitors typically meet with families weekly and may engage with a family for up to 2 years.

YOUR SUPPORT

OUTPATIENT & COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAMS

Florence Crittenton Outpatient and Community-Based programs offer an array of services for families of young children in our residential programs, those transitioning from our residential programs back to the community, and any family in the greater Lewis & Clark County area. While Florence Crittenton has offered community-based parenting classes and home visiting services for over 5 years to the Helena community, the addition of our outpatient services now allows us to serve those parents and caregivers that may need mental health and/or substance use disorder recovery, but do not require residential treatment. The combination of classes, home visiting, and outpatient services can give a family the opportunity to receive comprehensive, family-centered treatment and support, while remaining together in their own home.

Our outpatient and community-based services can be billed to a variety of insurance companies, including Medicaid, and are offered on a sliding scale making sure services are available to anyone seeking treatment, regardless of their ability to pay.


Outpatient Mental Health Services for Families

Rooted in Florence Crittenton's philosophy of caring for the whole person, we now offer outpatient treatment services that focus on addressing substance use and mental health within the context of the whole family. One of the most important components of substance use treatment for parents is treating the client within their family setting. Mothers, especially, report they do not access treatment for substance use due to fear they will have to leave their family.

Florence Crittenton's outpatient program's focus on addressing not just the immediate mental health or substance use disorder (SUD), but also address underlying trauma, while also examining

how these challenges are affecting a client's ability to parent. Services include individual and family therapy, substance use recovery groups, and case management.

These services can be accessed as a standalone, or in combination with other community-based services.



CONTINUUM OF CARE

Florence Crittenton works to achieve our goals through 3 divisions of services: Residential Śervices, o-5 Services, and Outpatient ⊘ Community-Based Services. Utilizing the ARC trauma responsive framework, FCHS programs that serve at-risk parents, young children, and young families effectively providing a continuum of care depending on the intensity of needs and support of each family. FCHS maintains a philosophy and standard of care that every family deserves to be tréated as a whole family, with dignity, compassion and respect.

In the last two newsletters, we gave a deeper explanation of our residential and o-5 Services. In this last installment of this 3-part series we will take a closer look at our Outpatient & Community Services.



AT WORK

Home Visiting Services

Home Visiting is an integral part of Florence Crittenton's continuum of care for families. The program serves a dual purpose within the organization: to provide support services to families as they transition out of residential programs back into their community; and to provide support services to families that may not need residential care but could benefit from additional education and support around parenting. We are proud to be a part of The Partnership for Families, a collaboration with AWARE, Florence Crittenton, and the Lewis & Clark County Health Department, that provides in-home supports to families in the greater L&C County area. Florence Crittenton has been providing the evidence-based SafeCare and Parents As Teachers home visiting services through this partnership for over 6 years to any family in these communities with children ages o-5. Additionally, we are now licensed to provide SafeCare services to families as part of their Family Drug Treatment plan or their treatment plan with Child Protective Services. All home visiting services are offered free of charge to any family.

Our staff are trained in their respective modalities and provide not only evidence-based curriculum, but can also serve as great support to parents as they navigate the often challenging and uncertain waters of early parenting. Many clients affectionately refer to their home visitor as their very own Mary Poppins!

Parenting Classes

Perhaps Florence Crittenton's most universal services are our parenting classes. We offer an array of classes that aim to increase parent knowledge and skills, help parents/caregivers relate their own childhood with their relationship to their child, attunement to their children, bonding and attachment, and creating a safe and healthy living environment. Classes run throughout the year and are open to all families with children o-5 in the greater Helena area. They can be offered within Florence Crittenton's Outpatient setting or through other community settings, such as churches and schools.


Circle of Security Parenting® - Attachment-based nurturing approach to understanding children's needs.


Love & Logic - Relationship-based natural consequences approach to parenting

The early investment increases the chances of success for families and improves outcomes for our entire community.

\$5,000

One month in our
Transitional Living Program
for mother's ages 12-21 and
their children.
It costs \$160 per day for food,
shelter, basic necessities, and
transportation.

\$3,000

One scholarship in our preschool for 6 months. Quality childcare is one of the most important aspects of stable income for a family. Childcare support decreases employee absences by up to 30% and job turnover by as much as 60%.

\$1,000 (\$80/month)

Diapers for 1 baby for 1 year. Florence Crittenton goes through an average of 25,000 diapers each year!

\$250 (\$20/month)

The cost of one of our staff to spend the night in the hospital with a client in labor that who otherwise be alone. Being there for our clients in these most critical moments is some of the most important work we do.

\$100

The cost of one home visit.

Our home visitors spend quality time, often in the evenings, with families; helping parents learn new skill, and working with children, and helping make homes safe.
